***The Safari Girls* Rescue the Legacy of An Unsung Hero**

Detroit, Michigan — *The Safari Girls* follows three women—Sissy, Mona, and Carmen—who reunite to commemorate their unforgettable journey to Africa 50 years earlier. When they discover their beloved mentor was fired for stealing, the reunion takes a dramatic turn. Readers will be treated to several plot twists as the women unravel the mystery that damaged the reputation of a trailblazing mentor, and could have transformed their lives.

“In the search for the truth about their mentor, each character undergoes their own revelation,” Renee says. “As their stories unfold, they disclose circumstances that compromise long-held beliefs.”

The Safari Girls offers readers a dual timeline in which past events affect present-day dilemmas. Sissy is facing eviction from the only home she has ever known because she is unable to move beyond the past. Carmen is juggling between her desire to reach the pinnacle of her career and her husband's invitation to retire into the sunset of their lives.

And Mona's determination to uncover the truth about their mentor exposes more than she bargained for.

“So many of us had mentors growing up that left indelible marks on our personalities,” Renee said. *The Safari Girls* uses wit, heart, and the unique perspective of women of a certain age to confront accusations about the woman they dubbed “Mrs. Superman” at a time when women’s empowerment was rare.
